- The dangers of slipping and tripping near mobile equipment and vehicles



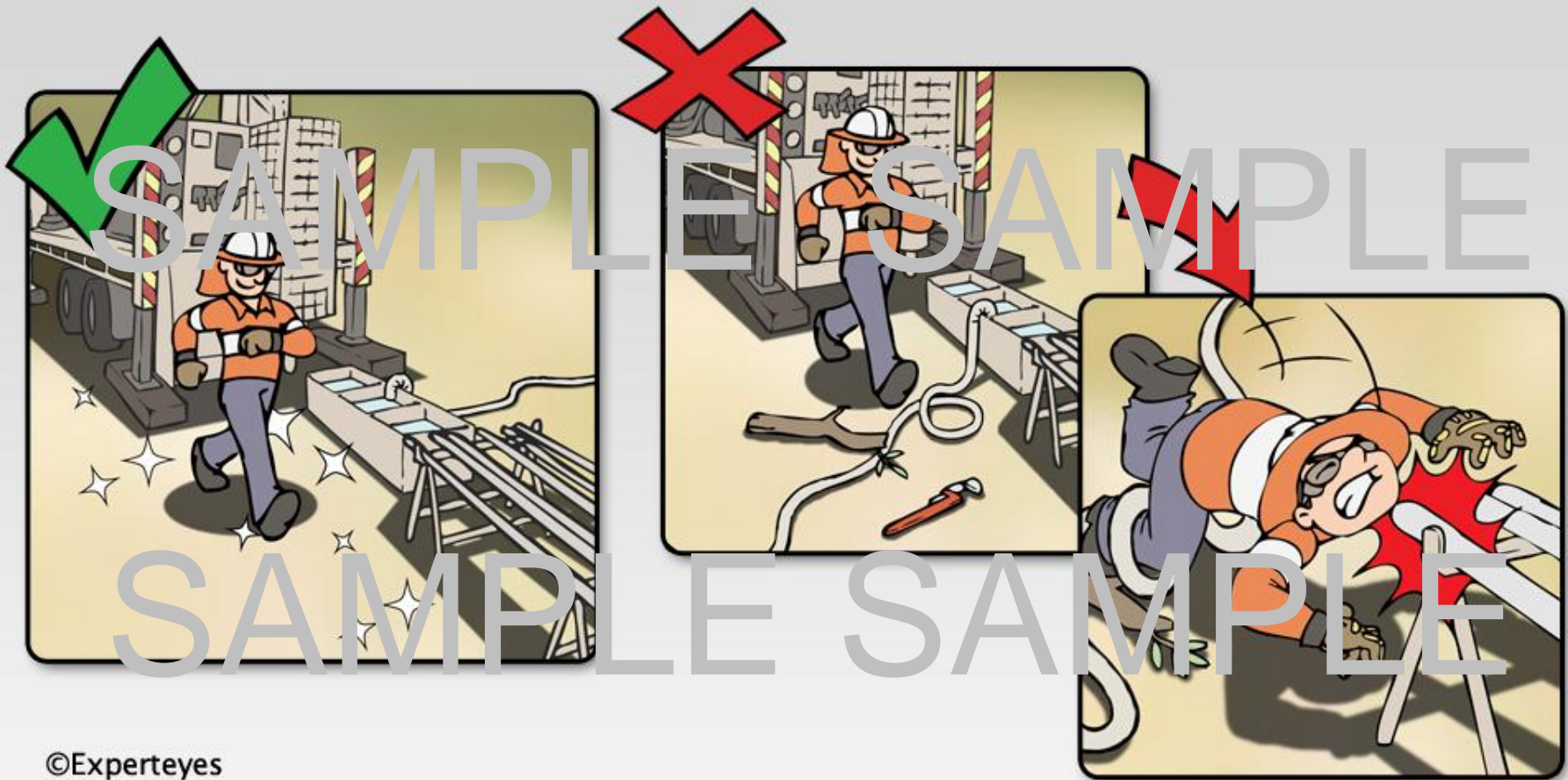

- Stand far enough away that a slip or trip will not result in being run over

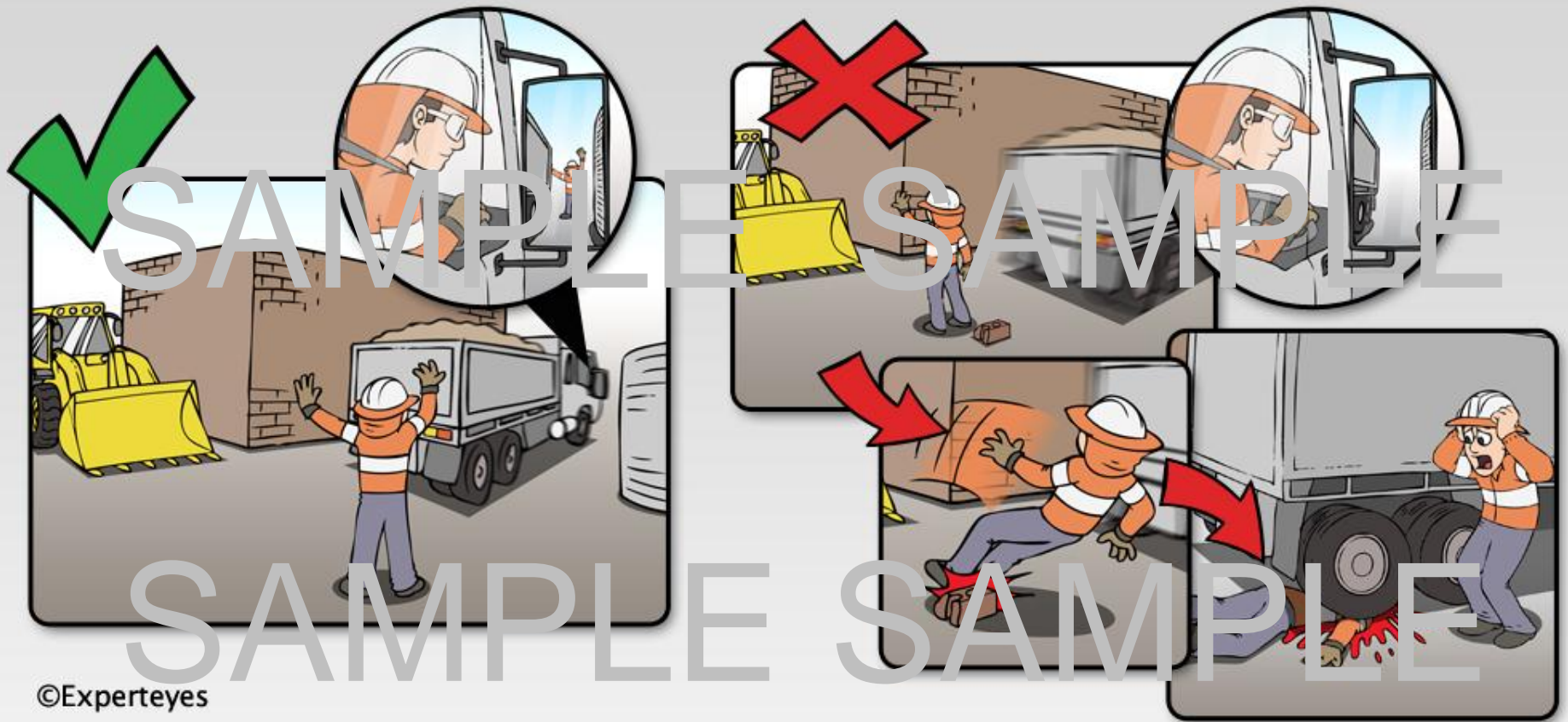

***Do not stand in a blind spot behind reversing equipment!***

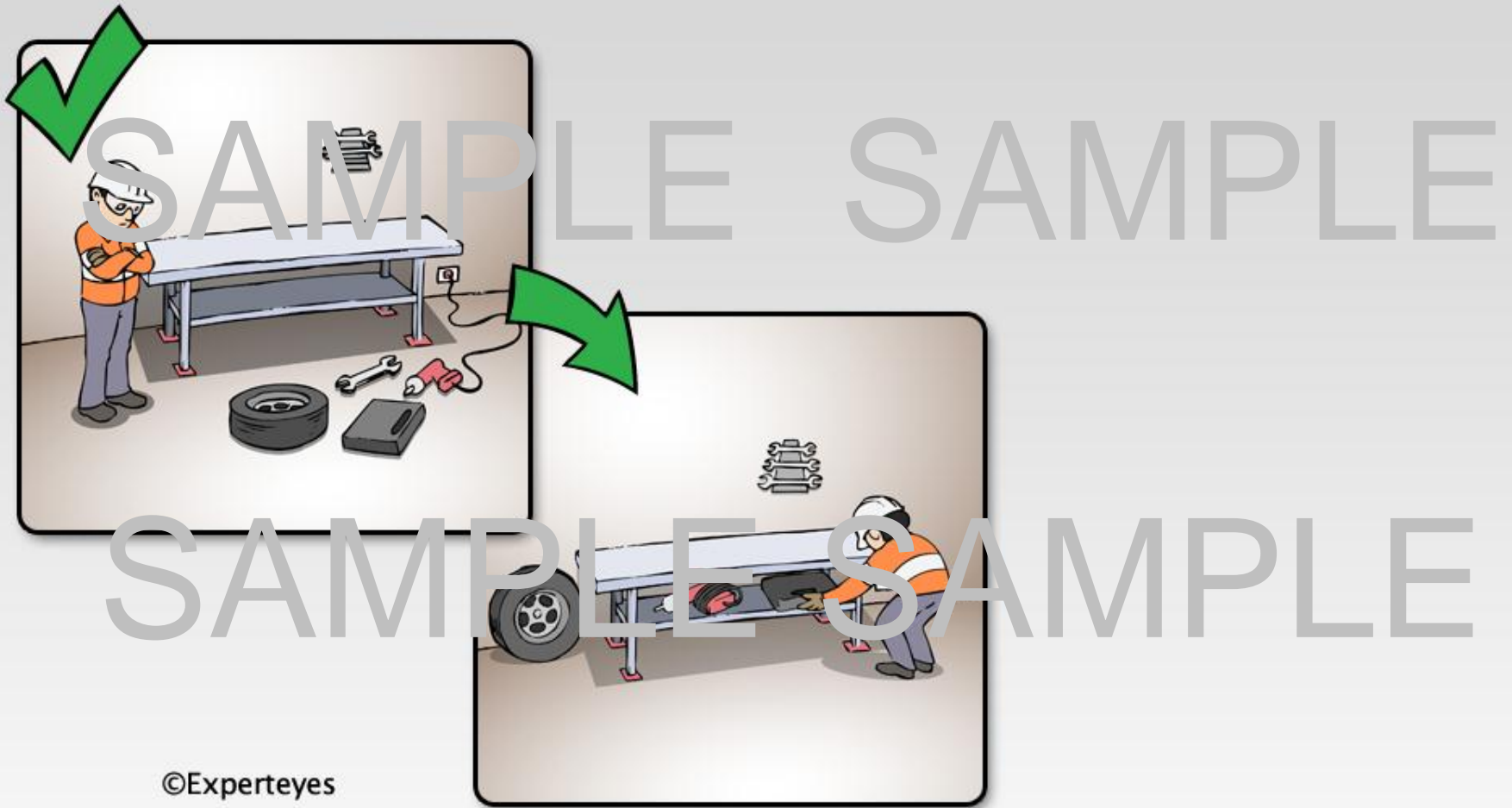
